<b>Walk Summary:</b>	<p>In brief – this is a two-day walk with a car camp in the middle and a car shuffle to both ends timed to coincide with the whale migration.</p> <p>Camp site bookings open six months ahead and must be paid for at booking.  <u>From January to April I will take expressions of interest.</u> At the time of booking in early May I will require a commitment of \$40 for the three nights (there is a partial refund policy so you won't do all of your dough)            Each site accommodates six people and I will book three sites. Once there are eighteen EOIs I will start a waiting list.            There is also a park entry fee of \$8 per day per car payable at the park.</p> <p>Friday 25<sup>th</sup> – drive to Saltwater Camping Ground – optional visit to Genoa Peak 4km            Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> – from Green Cape Lighthouse to Saltwater camping ground 17km            Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> – from Saltwater camping ground to Ben Boyd Tower 13km            Monday 28<sup>th</sup> – return home</p> <p>This is one of the best walks on the south coast of NSW. The Light to Light walk hugs the coastline between historic Boyds Tower and Green Cape Lighthouse. The views and coast line are stunning – you'll see heathland, forest, tea tree groves, banksia woodlands, sheltered coves and amazing red-rock platforms. With so many seafront vantage points you can spot sea birds, maybe seals and hopefully, whales.</p>
