Keep an eye out for the Whitebellied Sea Eagles as we explore the coastal waters of the estuary. Enjoy the beach walk to Dock Inlet, a unique and picturesque, land- locked expanse of fresh water isolated from the coast by a coastal dune barrier. Experience the natural beauty of the heathland and banksia as we travel back to the Yeerung River. The walk will commence at 8.00am to enjoy the morning bird song. This can be done as a day trip, or a weekend car camp, with travel to and exploration of Cape Conran walks local to the campground on Saturday, and this Yeerung Estuary and Dock Inlet walk on Sunday, before returning home. Walk will take about 30 minutes, gradual short climb through heathland to state followed by rainforest boardwalk and track to estuary. Several viewpoints to take in way and estuary lake at the end on the beach worth viewing. Walk around estuary ocean. Continue along beach to Dock Inlet approx. 7 kms over 2.5 hours including we snack breaks. Dock Lake is a freshwater lake, and water is drinkable. Spend time extended the dunes and the eastern side of the lake.
