Walk Summary:	<p>This walk will involve a series of reconnaissance walks as the walk leader has not visited this area in the last 40+ years!!! Nevertheless, the area has a reputation as being spectacular with some amazing geological features on display. Rock formations for the uninitiated!</p> <p>Plus, there is a lighthouse nearby if that's your thing.</p> <p>We will base ourselves at Bear Gully campsite Friday night and hopefully Saturday night (TBC). Participants unable to join us on Friday are welcome to join us on Saturday.</p> <p>Bear Gully campsite is located near Walkerville, and overlooks Wilsons Promontory, this camping area offers shady campsites set among tall Banksia near the shores of Waratah Bay. Campground facilities include drop toilets, communal fireplaces and picnic tables. There is no drinking water available and if you want a fire, bring firewood.</p> <p>Stretching along the coast from the sand barrier of Point Smythe to the sheltered waters of Waratah Bay, Cape Liptrap Coastal Park has strikingly beautiful scenery. The coastal park transforms from being a peaceful coastal area to wild, windy and awe inspiring in stormy weather.
